

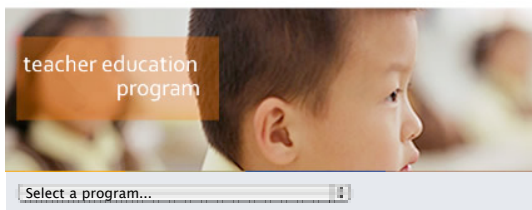

He met his FLAGS colleagues in July in a five-week French immersion experience at L'Université Laval in Québec, then proceeded in September with the 12-month program during which he did his practica in a Grade 6/7 class at Selkirk Elementary in Vancouver. He then spent the last part of his practicum teaching in a Grade 1 class in Quebec City.
