Adrian Burrus graduated with a BA from Vancouver Island University and taught in Korea and Czech Republic before completing the 12-month BEd Elementary Program - FLAGS (French Language and Global Study). He met his FLAGS colleagues in July in a five-week French immersion experience at L'Université Laval in Québec, then proceeded in September with the 12-month program during which he did his practica in a Grade 6/7 class at Selkirk Elementary in Vancouver. He then spent the last part of his practicum teaching in a Grade 1 class in Quebec City.



Adrian was known in FLAGS for his musical talents, often taking out his guitar and breaking into character ('Ti Jean). A gifted musician, Adrian performs original material in French and English. He is currently teaching a Grade 6/7 French Immersion class at Hastings Elementary in Vancouver.
